THREE LAKES, Oct. 15 (By News Correspondent) — Two small children, Donald Pownell, 4, and Jackie Flynn, 3 lost their lives late Saturday afternoon when they fell into Deer lake, near here.

Bodies of the two children were recovered from the lake a short time later by Gus Kloes and William Stamper.

The children's parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Flynn and Mr. and Mrs. John Pownell, and the grandmother of the children, Mrs. William Schoening, live on Deer lake. The children had been playing about the homes during the afternoon, but disappeared from the watch of the adults.

Tumbled off Dock

Apparently the small boys went to the dock in front of the summer home of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Wright of Milwaukee, and while playing on the end of the dock, fell into the lake. It is not certain that the Pownell child lost his life by drowning; it is possible his death was due to shock.

Mrs. Flynn was the first to see one of the bodies in the water when a search was made, and she called men from nearby. Mrs. Pownell is ill at her home.

Dr. R.A.A. Oldfield of Eagle River was called but efforts to resuscitate the children proved unsuccessful.
